Why This Handbook Matters

Common Types of Fraud

- Phishing Scams: Fraudsters posing as banks or companies via email or text.
- Investment Scams: Promises of guaranteed high returns with little or no risk.
- Romance Scams: Fake relationships designed to extract money or personal information.
- Business/Check Fraud: Fake invoices, altered checks, or unauthorized transactions.
- Identity Theft: Use of personal details to open accounts or commit crimes in another person's name.

Warning Signs & Red Flags

- Promises of high returns with no risk.
- Urgent requests for secrecy or immediate payment.
- Unverified links or suspicious email addresses.
- Pressure to send money or share information quickly.

How to Protect Yourself (Checklists)

- Verify sender information before sending money.
- Use two-factor authentication for online accounts and banking.
- Never share personal details via email or text.
- Monitor your credit reports and bank accounts regularly.
- Consult trusted family or professionals before making large financial decisions.
